Semi-finals are scheduled for 8:00 o'clock Friday evening (March 29); finals for 8:00 o'clock Saturday evening (March 30).

GENERAL CONDITIONS

Open to amateurs only. Each entrant must be a fully qualified member of a member club of the American Badminton Association, over 16 years of age as of January 1, 1940; must either be an American citizen, or if not, have maintained a continuous residence in the United States for at least the past three years.

The Tournament will be conducted under the official rules of the American Badminton Association. These rules will be rigidly enforced.

The Luncheon and Annual Meeting of the American Badminton Association, which all interested are privileged to attend, will be held at the New Washington Hotel Saturday, March 30, at 12:00 o'clock noon.
