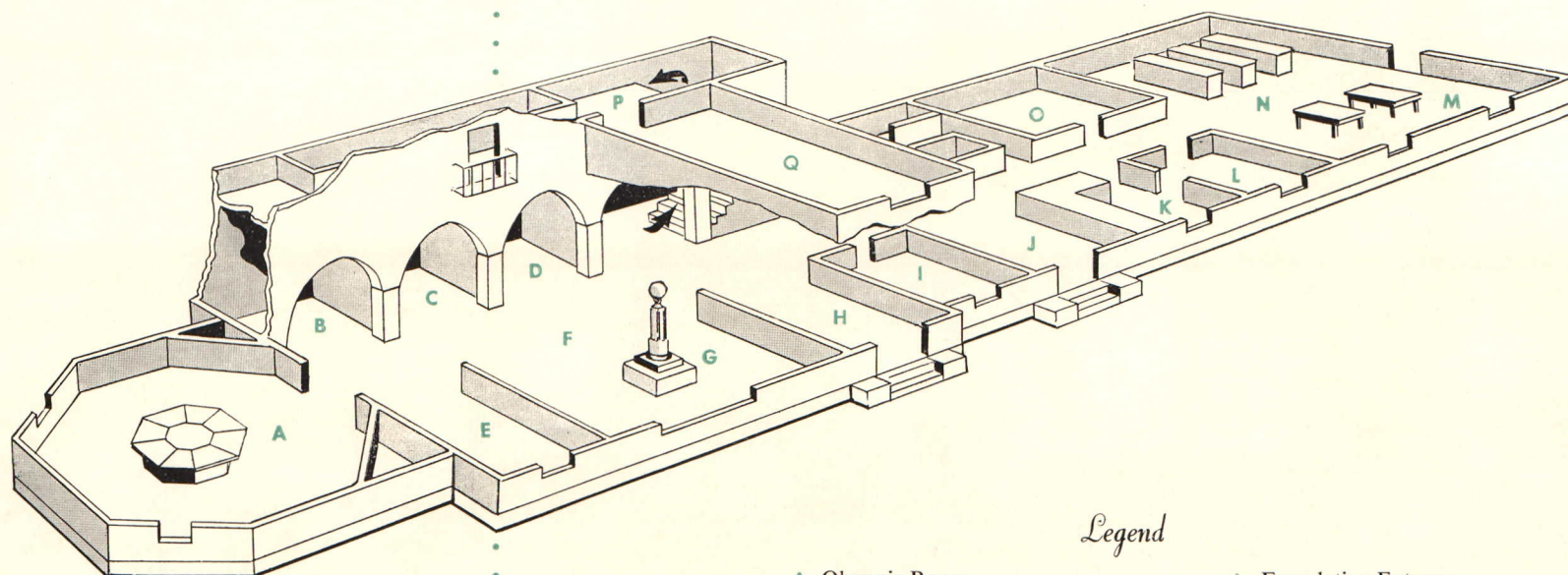

## REALIZATION OF A MAN'S DREAM



HELMS HALL is the realization of a man's dream.

Since his youth, the late Paul H. Helms, founder and sponsor of Helms Hall, looked forward to the creation of a philanthropic project which would typify his exceptional interest in athletics. This interest was enhanced by the achievements of his uncle, William Hoy, a famous baseball star of the early 'Nineties.

As an undergraduate at Syracuse University, Paul Hoy Helms won his block "S" letter as coxswain and commodore of his college crew. In later years, he participated actively in sports, maintaining a busy schedule in golf, skeet shooting and fishing. In addition, he was an enthusiastic follower of all sports—attending major football, basketball, track and field, tennis, swimming and baseball events, including the World Series.

Successful business enterprises enabled Mr. Helms to channel funds for the development of activities which have proven of particular benefit to athletics, and youth welfare. These activities were furthered through the interest of Mr. Helms and his family in the Olympic Games of 1932, which were

held in Los Angeles. All of this resulted in the establishment of Helms Athletic Foundation in 1936, a non-profit philanthropic institution which was designed to inspire youth and carry on the wholesome thoughts of the Olympic movement.

Helms Athletic Foundation has taken an active part in the furtherance and encouragement of worthy athletic activities. It has striven to honor those in the field of athletics throughout the world with its awards and trophies who are regarded deserving of special recognition.

Helms Hall is a sports shrine, teeming continually with activity. It is a gathering place for famous coaches, athletes and athletic leaders who participate in special programs. Lodged in Helms Hall are the trophies and awards which have been won by athletes and athletic teams the world over. These prove interesting items of display for visitors, both young and old alike.

It gave Mr. Helms satisfaction to know that his interests in sportsmanship and fair play were shared by so many who have acknowledged the sponsorships of Helms Athletic Foundation and Helms Hall, institutions which have propounded the well-chosen philosophies of Baron Pierre de Coubertin, founder of Modern Olympism.



## Helms Hall

THE FIRST unit of Helms Hall, comprising executive quarters and offices of Helms Athletic Foundation, Hall of Fame chambers, and Library, with adjoining patio, was dedicated on October 18, 1948.

A second unit, including the main entrance, Olympic Flag Room, Olympic Room, additional Halls of Fame, second-story offices, and Founder's Room, was completed on November 28, 1949.

A third unit of the sports shrine, including auditorium, Hall of Fame corridors, and Press Club, is contemplated.

Those honored in the sports shrine are determined by the Helms Hall Board, whose members, authorities in their field, are George T. Davis, Alex Kahn, Robert Myers, Rube Samuelson, Al Santoro, Ben Woolbert, Sid Ziff, Paul Zimmerman, W. R. Schroeder, and Paul H. Helms, Jr., Chairman.

## Helms Athletic Foundation

FOUNDED on October 15, 1936, Helms Athletic Foundation has given its support to athletic and youth activities which have been regarded worthy.

Working together with athletic agencies, colleges, and the Press, including representatives of Radio and Television, Helms Athletic Foundation has contributed both financially and physically to programs which have been developed for the furtherance of athletics.

The Foundation has been the donor of many trophies and awards for all sports, and their divisions. Champion athletes and distinguished athletic leaders have been the recipients of Helms awards.

Projects have included Athlete of the Year, and Athlete of the Month sponsorships; Athletic Halls of Fame; the Helms World Trophy; Rose Bowl Football Hall of Fame; and extensive sports research and library development.

Helms Athletic Foundation devoted much of its efforts to War Charities and the supervision of them during the War years, and it continues to contribute to charity endeavors.

Executives of the Foundation, long associated with the organization, are W. R. "Bill" Schroeder, Managing Director, Braven Dyer, Jr., Assistant Director, Margaret Farnum, Secretary.





**T**HE OLYMPIC FLAG ROOM, a focal point in Helms Hall, spreads beyond an arch which leads from the main entrance. Displayed on staffs extending from the walls of this spacious and charming room are the flags of nations which have served as Olympic Games hosts since 1896.

Center of attraction, however, is the Helms World Trophy which glistens from light provided by a huge twenty-foot-high window beside which it stands.

Tall, stately pillars supporting Hall of Fame trophies of gold, upon which appear the names of many of the greatest champions of sports, including those from the ranks of Baseball, Football, Track and Field, Golf, Tennis, Boxing, Swimming, Basketball, Automobile Racing and other recognized sports, line the Olympic Flag Room.

A series of connecting archways lends beauty to this section of Helms Hall.

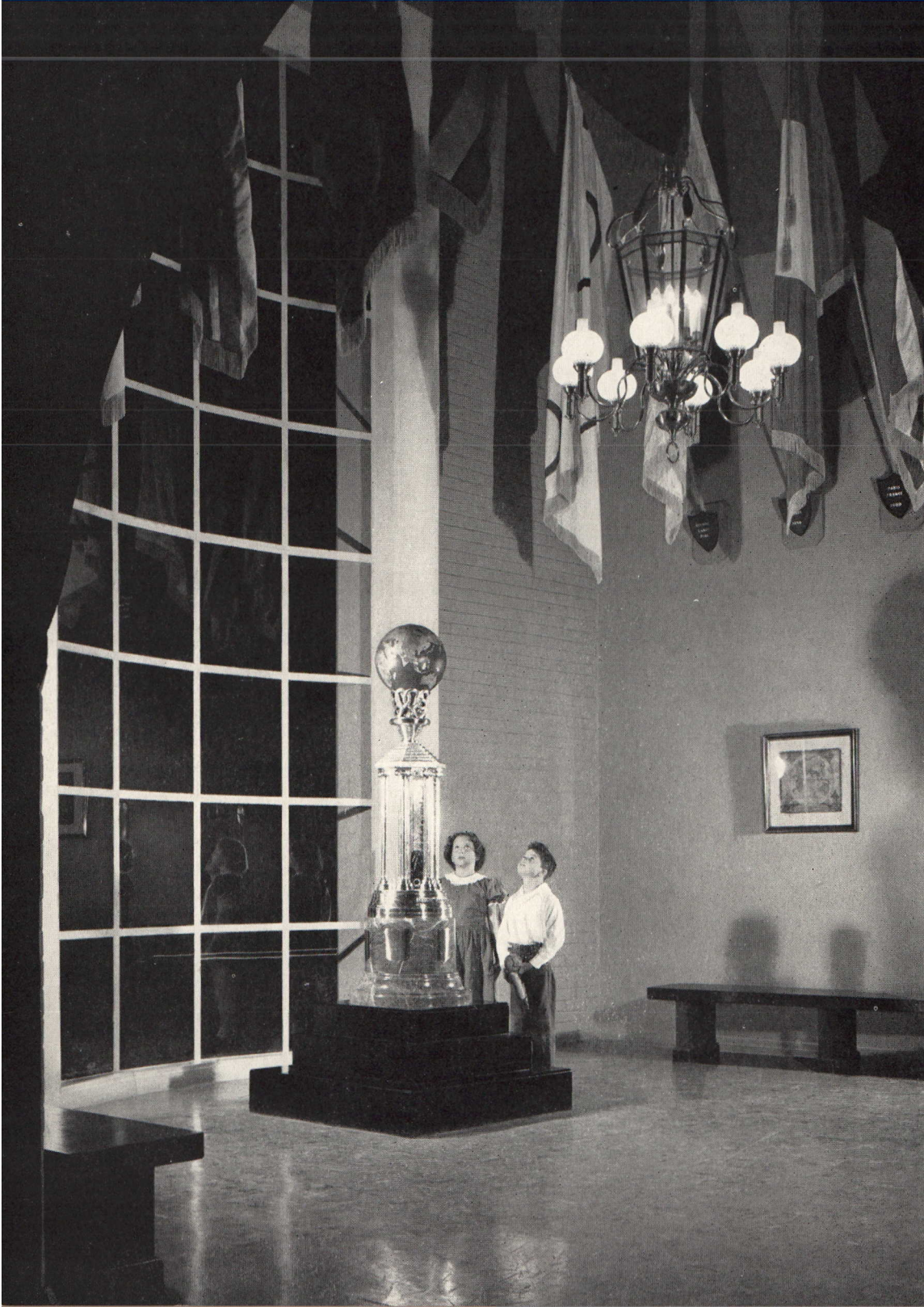
**T**WO OF THE arches of the Olympic Flag Room open into paneled alcoves which serve as Athlete of the Month and Athlete of the Year rooms. Posted here are the photographs of those who have been honored by the Helms Hall Board.

The main entrance of Helms Hall leads into Hall of Fame areas and photograph galleries, which feature chiefly Track and Field and Swimming. A stairway from this section leads to the second story of the building.

Sports mementos, gnarled athletic equipment, and shining trophies, all identified with important athletic contests of long ago, lodged throughout Helms Hall, provide visitors with displays of interest. Such displays include a racing bicycle of 1890 make, spikes worn by Olympic champions, gloves worn by famous pugilists of the ring, and even weights which, at one time or another, were hurled record-breaking distances.

Photographs of noted athletes in action, important athletic events, and stadia located in many sections of the world, cover the walls of the sports shrine.





## Helms World Trophy

MADE OF solid silver and gold, the Helms World Trophy supports a reproduction of the world, in relief, made of bronze and silver. Bright gems dot the locations of cities in which Olympic Games have been held in the past. The trophy rests upon a base of colorful marble. The over-all height is nearly eight feet.

The Helms World Trophy is lined with six gold panels, one for each Continent of the World—Africa, Asia, Australasia, Europe, North America and South America.

Purpose of the Helms World Trophy is that of honoring the foremost amateur athlete of each Continent, annually, with selections beginning in 1896, the year in which the first of the Modern Olympic Games was held.

Names of those chosen for honors have been engraved upon the Helms World Trophy.

Although Committees in the various Continents make recommendations, the Helms Hall Board determines selections.





## Athlete of the Year

ONE OF THE most coveted Helms awards is that which is presented annually to the Athlete of the Year. These selections, which date back to 1900, are determined by the Helms Hall Board in December, with presentations usually being made in January, during specially planned ceremonies.

The photographs of those chosen for Athlete of the Year honors are posted in the Helms Hall Athlete of the Year panel.



## Athlete of the Month

ONE OF THE Helms Athletic Foundation projects, which has attracted the interest of sports enthusiasts, has been the Athlete of the Month program.

The Helms Hall Board singles out each month an athlete for special recognition . . . gaining for the one chosen the Helms Athletic Foundation medal.

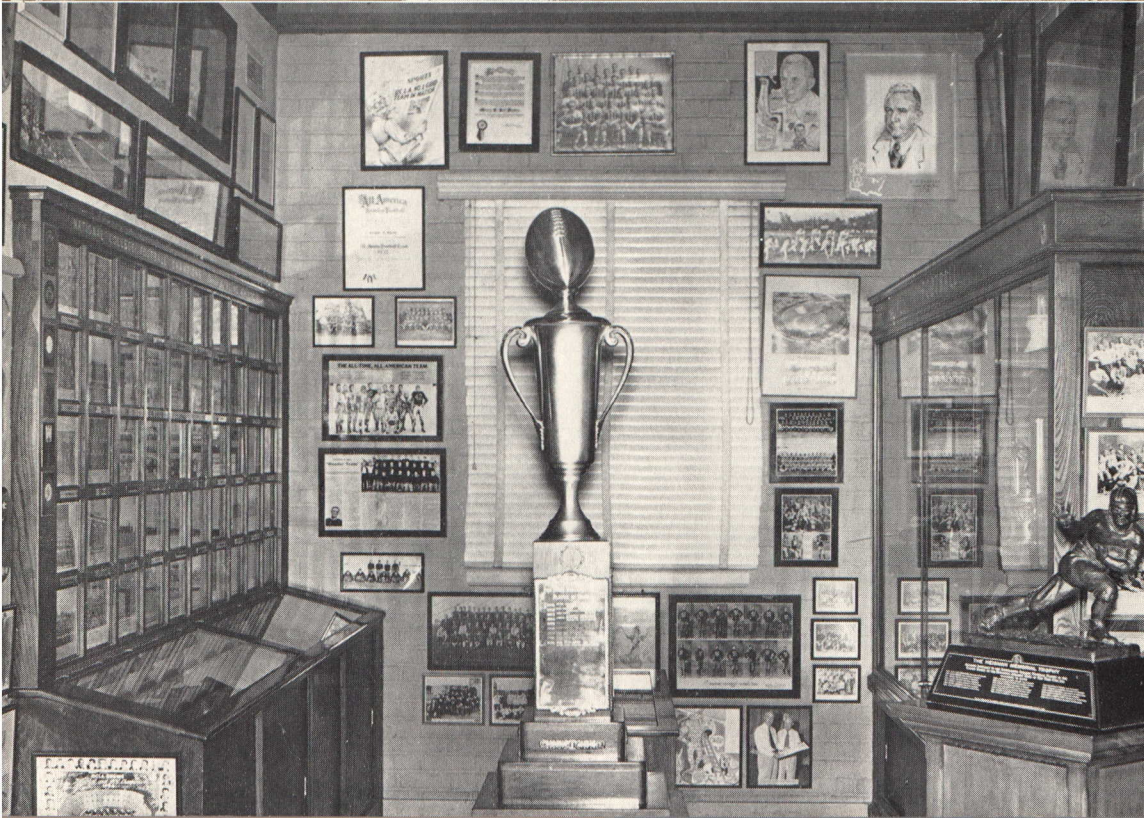
The photograph of the athlete so honored is then posted in the Athlete of the Month Hall of Fame panel.





## Baseball

TROPHIES WON by championship teams, gloves worn by all-time "greats," uniforms which were donned by Hall of Fame stars, attractive plaques which were presented by major league baseball clubs, and photographs of World Series champion teams are among the treasures of fandom which are lodged in trophy cases, and upon the walls of the Baseball section of Helms Hall.



## Football

ROSE BOWL game footballs; shoes, now bronzed, worn by immortals of football in competition; jerseys worn by those christened for All-America laurels; reproductions of Stagg and Rockne; oil paintings by coaches "Pop" Warner and Robert Zuppke; and photographs of National Championship teams, and such notables as Grange and Thorpe, sharpen the interest of those who visit the Football section of Helms Hall.

Needless to note, Walter Camp is immortalized here.

## Olympic Room

A SECTION of particular importance, developed with dignity and character, is the Olympic Room. Lodged here, and here only, are the awards which have been won by Olympic Games champions.

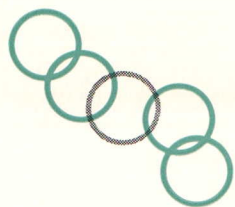
Framed scrolls, official posters, plaques, photographs and other mementos relating to the Olympic Games of the past, are displayed in the Olympic Room.

Striking is the Olympic Room setting, with its colorful walls; trophy cases of contrasting finish; massive center-table display case; terrazzo flooring of well-chosen hues; and unique world-globe lighting fixture which extends gracefully from the beamed ceiling.

Through the large Olympic Room doorway, from within, it is possible to gain an interesting view of Helms Hall beyond the arches of the Olympic Flag Room, the Helms Athletic Foundation quarters, and the Library room. This provides the longest line of vision in the sports shrine, bringing together the most distant points.

Conferences and meetings of importance are frequently held in the Olympic Room.

Helms Athletic Foundation cherishes the Olympic Cup award which was presented to it in 1961 by the International Olympic Committee in recognition of "noteworthy contributions to Olympism."

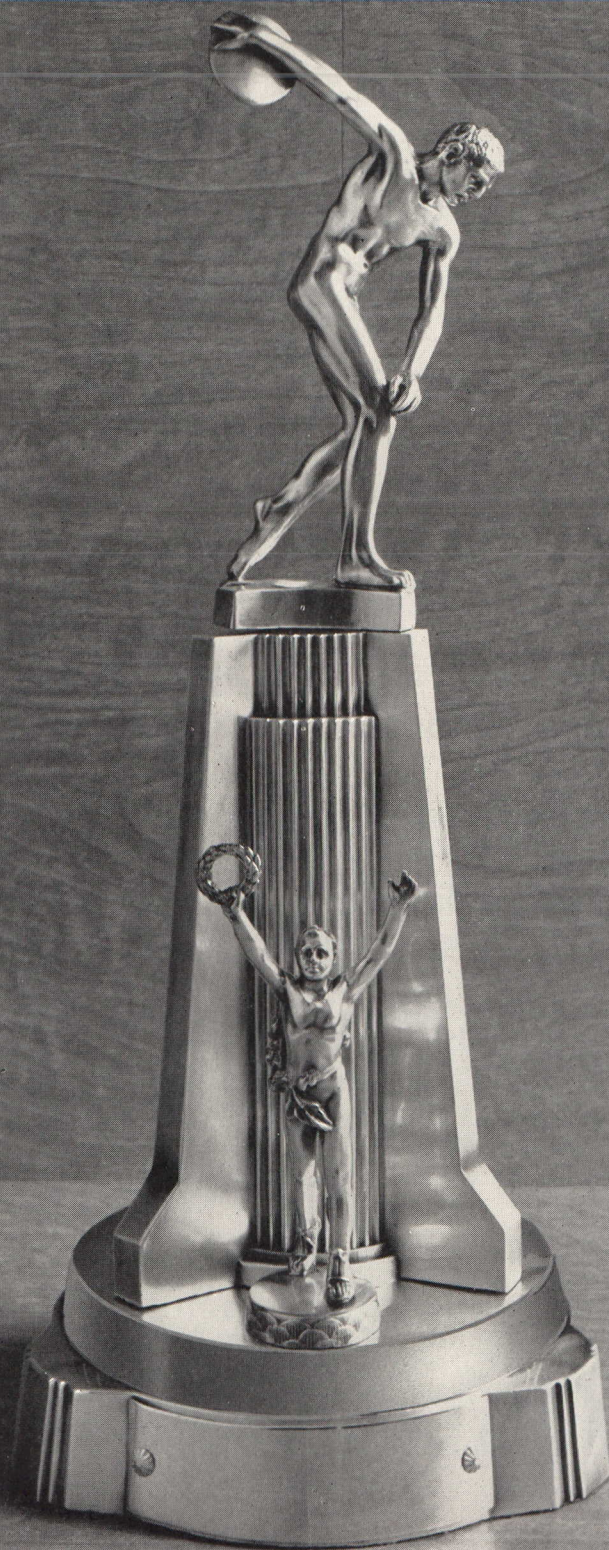


# A W A R D S

ALTHOUGH Helms Athletic Foundation awards have numbered in the thousands, since 1936, there are several which are presented sparingly—to those who achieve in noteworthy manners. These include the Helms Athletic Foundation medallion, the Helms Athletic Foundation commemorative medallion, the distinctive Helms Athletic Foundation trophy, and the stunning Helms World Trophy silver plaque.

Athletes of the Month, and those chosen for special recognition have been the recipients of Helms Athletic Foundation medallions. Those making exceptional contributions to sports are presented with Helms Hall commemorative medallions. The Helms Athletic Foundation trophy is restricted to perpetual competitions of importance, and for Hall of Fame honors.

The Helms World Trophy silver plaque, set into a striking plastic case, is presented only to the six amateur athletes who are chosen for Athlete of the Year honors, in the six Continents.

MOST IMPORTANT of all of the Helms Athletic Foundation and Helms Hall awards is the Helms World Trophy silver plaque.

This charming award, encased in sparkling plastic, is presented annually to each of the Helms World Trophy winners in the six Continents.

These Halls of Fame have been developed in College and Professional Football, Baseball, Track and Field, Basketball, Tennis, Golf, Boxing, Swimming, Automobile Racing and other organized sporting endeavors.

Most important of the Halls of Fame is that which recognizes those who, in the opinion of the Helms Hall Board, have contributed most to sports. Ten were named in the original elections, in 1948, with subsequent elections being held annually.

## Library

THE HELMS HALL sports library is one of the most complete in existence. It covers all sports, and all of their divisions — amateur, collegiate and professional.

The library has been developed over a period of more than thirty years, and it contains hundreds of volumes, booklets, magazines, newspaper files, record compilations, college year books, photographs and historical documents.

Since 1936, countless sports collections of importance, covering many fields, have been added to the Helms library. Some have been donated; others have been purchased.

The Helms Hall library is open to those who conduct sports research, without charge. It is indexed in the manner which is accepted by the Library of Congress, making it easily accessible for use by skilled historians.

Many rare volumes, and collector's items, dating far into the Nineteenth Century, are included in the Helms Hall library.



## Golf and Tennis



GOLF, TENNIS, National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Fame, and the Southern California High Schools Athletic Hall of Fame are featured on the second floor of Helms Hall. Visitors may catch glimpses of the famous champions of these sports, whose photographs are posted upon the walls, as they ascend the stairway leading from the main floor. Trophies and plaques also adorn the walls in this section.

Similar sections, featuring other sports, are located in various chambers and halls of the sports shrine.

Beyond, in adjoining quarters, are the offices of the Southern California Committee for the Olympic Games.

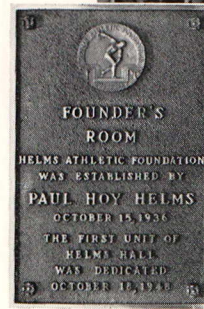


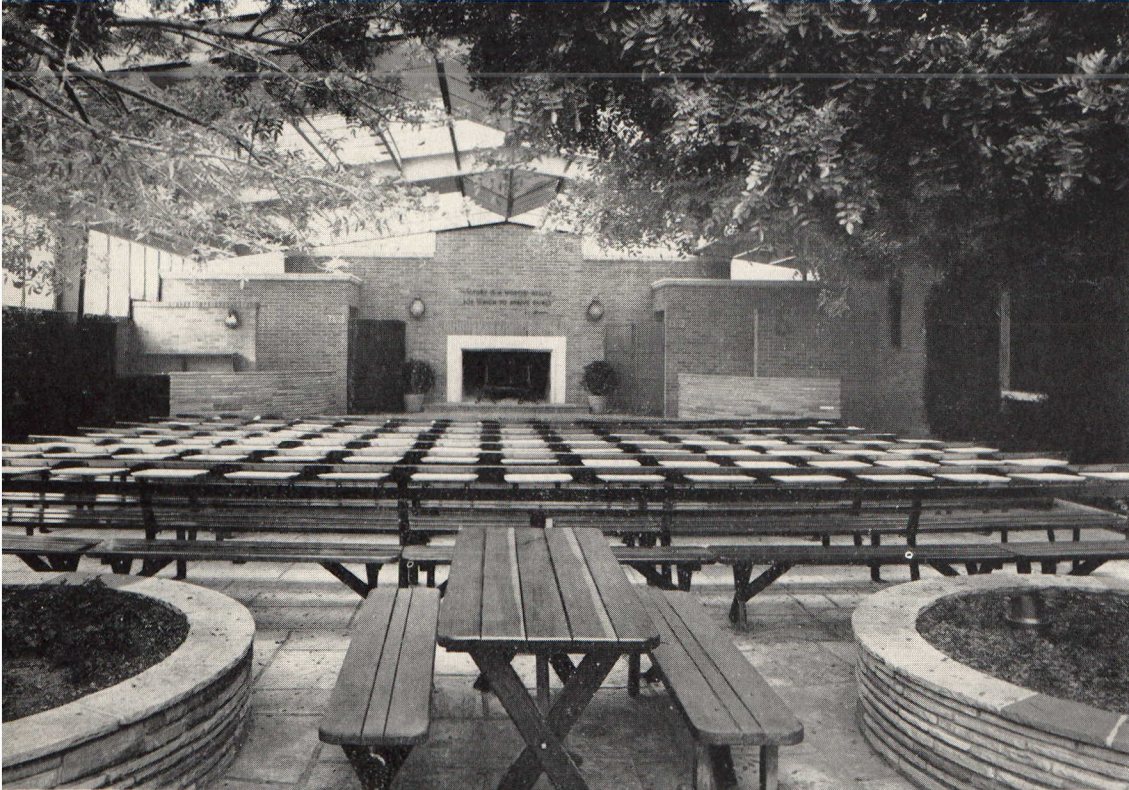
## Founder's Room

Also displayed in the Founder's Room, in a dignified manner, are the original signatures of Presidents, beginning with George Washington, being accompanied, in frames, by commemorative inauguration medallions, and engraved likenesses of the Presidents.





## Patio Activities

THE PATIO, adjoining Helms Hall, with its vine-covered brick walls, flag-stone flooring and tree-wells, shade trees, redwood tables and benches, bright flower beds, attractive lighting fixtures, and huge inviting fireplace, is the scene of many Helms Hall gatherings and special award programs.

It is here that famous coaches, athletic leaders, and athletes gather around the fireside to relate never-to-be-forgotten tales of spirited sports competitions of the past. It is here, also, that noted sports authorities join members of the Press for important meetings and programs.

Civic clubs, and other organizations frequently sponsor Helms Hall activities, bringing in their members and guests to participate in festivities as well as ceremonies.

Bronze plaques, commemorating achievements and sportive classics which are dear to the hearts of sportsmen, are found on the walls surrounding the Helms Hall patio.

Dining facilities are available in the patio, and are used often for dinner parties and programs, as well as for barbecues and the like, for youngsters.







## Rose Bowl Trophy

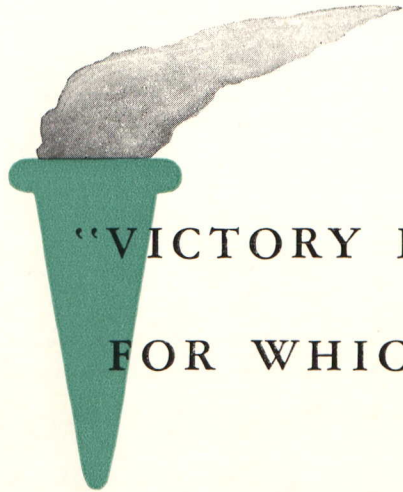
THE ROSE BOWL TROPHY, donated by Paul H. Helms, and dedicated at Helms Hall on October 14, 1950, with officials of the Pasadena Tournament of Roses Association, football coaches, All-Americans, athletic leaders, and members of the Press attending, is one of the most beautiful of all of the Helms Athletic Foundation trophies.

Encased attractively, behind plate glass, the Rose Bowl Trophy serves to record the results of Tournament of Roses football classics which have been staged in Pasadena since 1902.

This is the trophy for which the rival Rose Bowl teams contest each New Year's Day. It is lodged permanently in the Rose Bowl Hall of Fame in Pasadena, where Rose Bowl visitors may see it throughout the year.


The Rose Bowl Trophy, of large bowl design, is made of silver, with decorative rose developments encircling it, being lined inside with gold.
