NEJO 2010 FACTS

- The New England Junior Open 2010 [NEJO] is hosted by Marblehead Youth Badminton (www.marbleheadyouthbadminton.org) and is a USA Badminton sanctioned event (www.usabadminton.org)
- > Tournament Director is MYB's Head Coach, Nick Vered, a former NEJO winner in 1999 and 2000
- > There are 110 registrants competing at the Marblehead High School on November 20-21, 2010
- Age categories of males and females range from Under 9 to Under 22 [U9, U11, U13, U15, U17, U19, U22]
- First Place, Second Place, and First Place Consolation medals will be awarded
- Junior players have arrived from 9 states: CT, MD, NC, NH, NJ, NY, OH, PA, as well as from 14 towns in MA
- The first NEJO was held March 9-10, 1996, on 4 courts in the Swampscott High School gymnasium, started by Gut 'n Feathers Club members Beth Sopka and Barb McKinley, a former Junior National champion
- Former NEJO events have attracted international participation from Canada, Peru, Russia, Germany, Hungary, Jamaica, Trinidad & Tobago, Kenya, Uganda
- The Badminton World Federation in England establishes the rules and standards for international competition and manages the world's player ranking system
