

1994 MBBC International Junior Championships

The Manhattan Beach Badminton Club International Junior Championships event was held August 17 - 21. Seven excited people crammed into a minivan for an 18-hour nonstop (other than changing drivers) trip from Portland to Los Angeles. The eager group hit the road at 4:30 p.m. and arrived at 10:30 the next morning, a surly bunch.

The tournament showcased some excellent play. Entrants came from Canada, Barbados, Brazil, Mexico, Peru, Indonesia and Germany.

Our four juniors, Michelle Boje, Peter Collins, Andrew Ellmaker and Aline Vannarath, coached by Jimmie Long, had an excellent tournament; they all played well and received medals. In Aline's first major tournament, she placed third in the Under 12 Girls' Doubles and reached the semifinals of the Under 12 Mixed with Andrew. Andrew also reached the semifinals of the Under 12 Boys' Singles. He lost in an intense 3-game match against Raju Rai of Georgia. Raju and Andrew teamed up to easily win the Under 12 Boys' Doubles.

Michelle and Peter each lost in tough first round matches in the Under 14 Singles. Peter played an extremely difficult match against a junior from Peru while Michelle drew the No. 2 ranked girl in the U.S. They each played well and went on to easily capture their consolation titles.

Michelle and Peter paired off in the Under 14 Mixed and cruised through the finals for the gold, beating the No. 2 ranked U.S. team in the semifinals and a Peruvian team in the finals. Michelle also seized the gold in the Under 14 Girls' Doubles with Caren Hueckstadt from Germany.

Peter and Sean Ruktoume came in second in the Under 14 Boys' Doubles against a Peruvian team. Unfortunately, by this time Peter was suffering from a sprained ankle and Sean from a sore shoulder and they could not withstand the pressure from the Peruvians.

After the week of intensive play, the juniors and their chaperones trooped around Disneyland from 9:00 a.m. to midnight. Then at 1:00 a.m., seven weary people started back for Portland, arriving 19 hours later. Thank goodness this only once a year.

Juniors at 1994 Oregon State Games

The excitement in the Oregon State Games was in the junior events. Michelle Boje won big in the junior division with three gold medals and a silver in the Adults' B Women's Doubles. Aline Vannarath of Portland took two golds and a silver.

Salem sent a large group including: Chad Boswell, Casey Howe, Dahir Jacobo, Dawn Renner, Chrystal Nelson, David Reynolds, Marisa Varay and Misty Wagner. They all did extremely well with 3 golds, 7 silvers and 6 bronzes. Thanks to Sharon Moore, Andy Stich and Debbie Vassallo in their work with these juniors, badminton will continue to grow.
