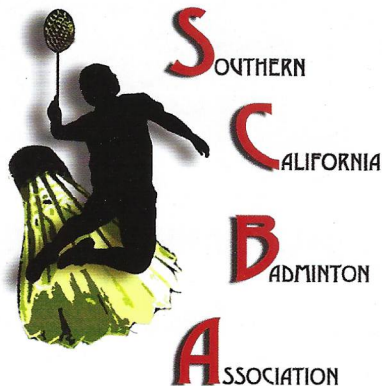

How to Start a Badminton Club:

May 2010

1. Assemble a group, 8-16 or more players, interested in playing Badminton on a regular basis.
2. Choose a "Leader" who has time and interest in heading up a new club and who will be responsible for:
 - A. Locating a facility or gym where the club members can play.
 - 1) High School, Junior College, or College gym; Park and Recreation facility; Private facility.
 - 2) Check required space needed for badminton courts (2-3 courts suggested Min.)
Width - 20', Length - 44', Minimum ceiling height 20'-25'
 - B. Negotiating an agreement with the person in charge of the gym or facility:
 - 1) Rental or fee for use of the facility (per use basis or per player charge)
Park and Recreation facilities may be more available at a lesser cost.
 - 2) Check if insurance is required or a waiver of liability for each player is needed.
USA Badminton can provide inexpensive liability insurance for clubs and tournaments.
 - 3) Check facility if badminton court lines are already on gym floor.
 - a) Make arrangement to have court lines painted on floor or
 - b) Use colored vinyl tape (1" to 1.5") for temporary court lines.
 - 4) Check to see if badminton posts or standards are available. If not, then
 - a) Use anchors in walls to attach the nets and a ratcheting device to tighten.
 - b) Make free standing standards with wheels (contact Bob Lewis - SCBA for design)
 - c) Buy free standing standards (ex. Yonex)
 - 5) Have someone responsible to open and CLOSE the facility, to set up and take down nets and standards and to clean up.
 - 6) Will the club provide shuttles to buy or will everyone bring their own?
 - C. Membership dues:
 - 1) Will there be a fee to join the club?
 - 2) Will there be a cost to play badminton on a per time basis or monthly fee basis etc?
 - 3) Who will collect fees and be responsible for accounting?

It is our job as Line Judges to be impartial (not to be influenced, distracted or intimidated by any team, player, coach or spectator) in making a call. The Line Judge is solely responsible for the line assigned. We work hard to attain high skill levels and to look, act and be professional in our work on the court. Line Judge clinics and training will be provided. You must have experience in badminton or be a player, and have a good working knowledge and understanding of the game.

Origins of the Game

The sport of badminton has its origins in ancient civilizations in Europe and Asia. The ancient game known as battledore (bat or paddle) and shuttlecock probably originated more than 2000 years ago. In the 1600s Battledore and Shuttlecock was an upper class pastime in England and many European countries. Battledore and Shuttlecock was simply two people hitting a shuttlecock backwards and forwards with a simple bat as many times as they could without allowing it to hit the ground.

A contemporary form of badminton - a game called 'Poon', was played in India in the 1800s where a net was introduced and players hit the shuttlecock across the net. British officers in the mid 1800's took this game back to England and it was introduced as a game for the guests of the Duke of Beaufort at his stately home 'Badminton' in Gloucestershire, England where it became popular.

In March 1898, the first Open Tournament was held at Guildford the first 'All England' Championships were held the following year. Denmark, the USA and Canada became ardent followers of the game during the 1930s.

IBF Established

Then in 1934, the International Badminton Federation was formed, with the initial members including England, Wales, Ireland, Scotland, Denmark, Holland, Canada, New Zealand and France, with India joining as an affiliate in 1936. The first major IBF tournament was the Thomas Cup (world men's team championships) in 1948. Since then, the number of world events has increased with the addition of the Uber Cup (women's team), World Championships (individual events), Sudirman Cup (mixed team), World Junior Championships, World Senior Championships, and the World Grand Prix Finals.

Beginning in 2004 the IBF moved its office away from England for the first time in its 70 year history to Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, changed its name to the Badminton World Federation (BWF), and introduced the 21 point rally scoring system. Along with these dramatic changes the BWF decentralized forming five Continental Confederations: Europe, Asia, Africa, Oceania, and Pan America. Badminton is now one of the most popular sports in the world with 164 registered countries and over 150 million competitors.

Olympic Games Sport – 1992

Badminton is a relatively new Olympic Games sport. After being a demonstration sport in Munich in 1972, badminton became an Olympic sport in Barcelona in 1992 with the singles and doubles disciplines introduced for the first time in the Olympic Games. In Atlanta in 1996, a mixed doubles event was included and this is the only mixed doubles event in all of the Olympic sports. Only five countries have won the gold medals since its introduction in 1992 - China (8), Indonesia (5) and Korea (5) and Denmark (1).

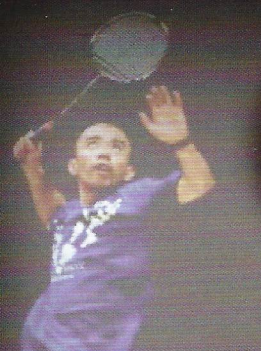

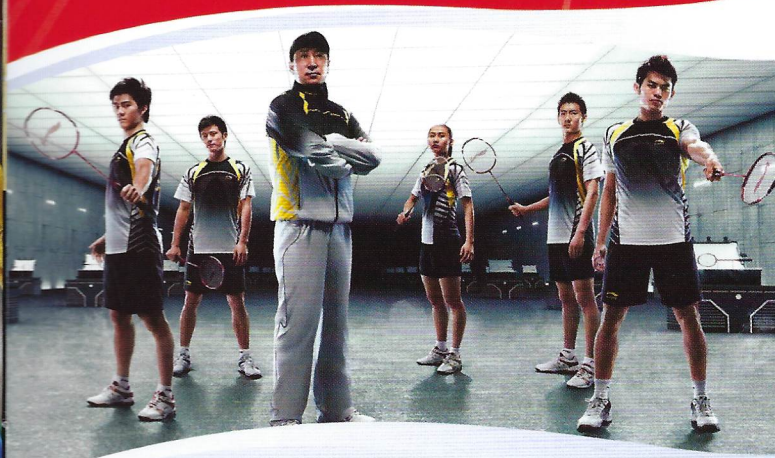

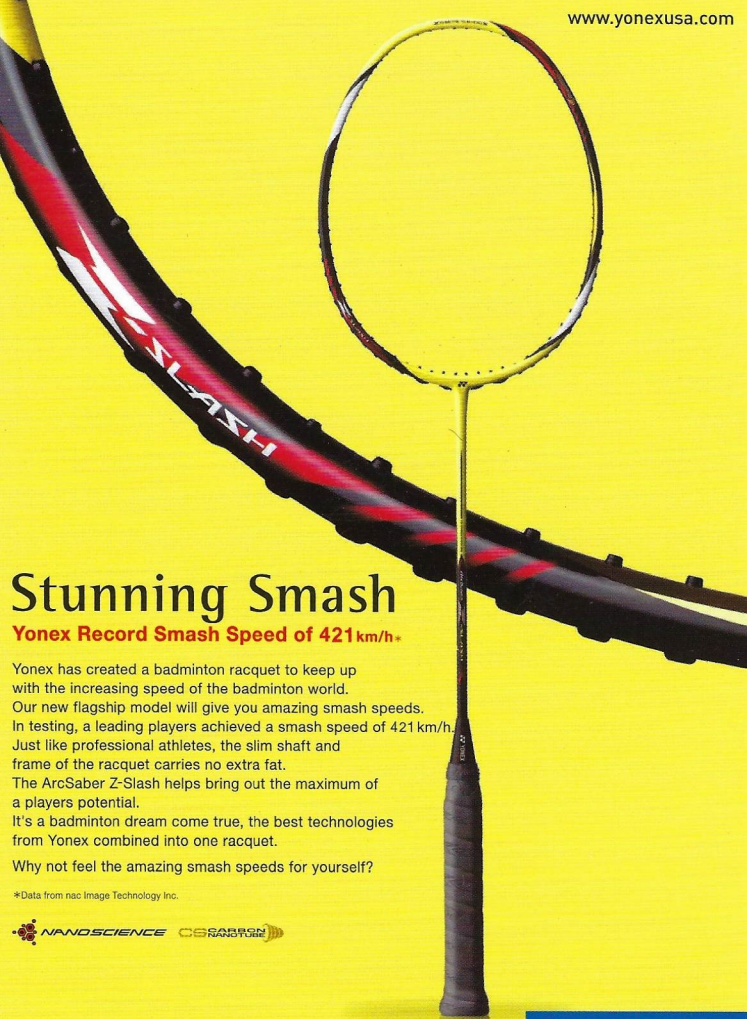
